

Montgomery GI Bill (Chapter 30)

The Montgomery GI Bill (MGIB) is available for those who enlist in the U.S. Armed Forces. Under Chapter 30, Active Duty members enroll and pay \$100 per month for 12 months; and are then entitled to receive a monthly education benefit once they have completed a minimum service obligation. Benefits are available to you for 10 years after ending active duty. The program provides up to three years of educational benefits towards your degree or certificate program.

Survivors & Dependents Assistance (DEA) (Chapter 35)

Dependents' Educational Assistance provides education and training opportunities to sons, daughters, or spouse of a deceased, disabled, or captive veteran. The program offers up to 45 months of education benefits with limitations varying for age, and the circumstances surrounding the veteran's discharge.

Vocational Rehabilitation & Employment Program (Chapter 31)

The Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (VR&E) Program is authorized by Congress under Title 38, USC, Chapter 31 and Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21. It is sometimes referred to as the Chapter 31 program. This program assists Veterans with [service-connected disabilities](#) to prepare for, find, and keep suitable jobs. For Veterans with service-connected disabilities so severe that they cannot immediately consider work, this program offers services to improve their ability to live as independently as possible.
